1. JOB SUMMARY:

The Pediatrician's primary responsibility is to provide outpatient and if applicable inpatient clinical services. As a key point of reference for pediatric complications, they may be on call 24 hours a day during deployment. This position will oversee a multidisciplinary clinical team, ensuring compliance with clinical protocols and the delivery of high quality compassionate clinical care

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function with or without reasonable accommodation.

2. Scope of Work

The pediatrician will be responsible for the following activities:

- Provide pediatric/neonatal consultation, treatment, and follow-up services in accordance with internationally accepted standards (World Health Organization/ Ministry of Health/ IMC) ensuring patients are treated in a dignified and caring manner.
- Ensure integrated care for newborns and children through emergency, outpatient and inpatient services.
- Diagnose and treat a wide range of pediatric conditions, including malnutrition, infectious diseases, and trauma.
- Order, perform, and interpret diagnostic tests as well as collect, record, and maintain patient information and histories.
- Prescribe and administer treatments, therapies, medications, and vaccinations. Discuss test results and prescribed treatments with patients and family members as well as monitor patients' conditions and progress.
- In the Inpatient unit, conduct daily rounds on patients, initiate case discussions, monitor and document patient progress with any changes in management and prognosis and ensure adequate handover.
- Oversee the smooth running of the pediatric service and its patient flow.
- Advise on the referral procedure from the maternity and postpartum wards.
- Competent in the management of all pediatric emergencies
- Ensure notifiable disease reporting and a follow-up system is used if required.
- Ensure clinical governance systems are in place.
- Participate in health education sessions for caregivers and community members including advising patients and their guardians on diets, activities, hygiene, and disease prevention.
- Contribute to data collection and reporting for health monitoring and evaluation.
- Manage and supervise other clinical staff as required; participate in hiring process if needed.
- Identify training needs and capacity gaps of the team, provide relevant on-the-job training as required.
- Supervision and mentorship of clinical staff, including regular case discussions as part of hands-on training.
- Ensures patient data protection and confidentiality of patient data.
- Actively participate in any internal meetings and any other relevant external meetings as required.
- Adhere to and report any medical incident based on IMC policies and procedures.
- Support country mission in setting up pediatric unit, nursery and neonatal units as required.

Perform other duties as assigned. The duties and responsibilities listed in this document are representative of the nature and level of work assigned and not necessarily all inclusive.

3. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Typically, Medical degree with specialization in Pediatrics/neonatology.
- Valid medical license to practice.
- Minimum of 5 years' experience in pediatrics, with prior humanitarian field experience preferred.
- Strong clinical skills and ability to work in resource-limited settings.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to adapt to changing environments and stressful conditions.
