MSF offers assistance to people based on need, irrespective of race, religion, gender, or political affiliation.

MSF SPAIN is advertising for the following position: Medical Doctor – Full Time in Damascus.

Requirements for the position	
Education:	 Essential: Medical Doctor degree or equivalent. Desirable training in public health, tropical medicine, epidemiology, or related field.
Experience:	 Essential: minimum 2 years' experience as a Medical Doctor or in clinical work (can be within medical training). Desirable experience in tropical medicine, or post-registration experience in managing public health programs, infectious diseases, HIV/AIDS/STDs, or TB. Experience with MSF or other INGOs in developing countries is an asset.
Languages:	Essential: Fluency in Arabic and English, (high level command in spoken and written communications)
Others:	Advanced computer literacy (word, excel). Desirable experience with statistical software (SPSS, R, STATA etc.).

Contract of Employment	Service Agreement for 1 month, renewable.
Main objectives	Provide outpatient and/or inpatient medical care to patients/beneficiaries according to adapted and updated medical knowledge, MSF protocols, values and universal hygiene standards to improve the patients/beneficiary's health conditions.
Main responsibilities and tasks	 Objective 1: Responsible for country epidemiological surveillance Establish contact and networks with other organizations and consortia involved in surveillance and health programming. Coordinate with epidemiology and surveillance counterparts in other MSF sections, partner organization, and DoH in collaboration with the Epidemiological Activity Manager. Participate and document recurring meetings of national health sector, nutrition sector, cluster and others. Support in the implementation and improvement of an effective surveillance system, including project components and sentinel alert systems. Collect and analyze passive surveillance data through publicly accessible sources. Coordinate with Epidemiology Activity Manager and HPCE (Health Promotion and Community Engagement) team to oversee CBS (Community-Based Surveillance) programs in areas of priority. Inputs in assessments proposal, planning and implementation through background research, maps and other technical aspects. Regular communication with the Epidemiology Activity Manager. Objective 2: Support the Mission Emergency Response Team in data analysis to inform decision making
	 Create a data entry interphase, enter, correct and export data. Enter, download questionnaires and data from Kobo; create and update epidemic curves and tables of descriptive statistics, indicators and graphs in Excel, Plan and analyze field-based surveys with support from the Epidemiology Activity Manager.

- Produce summary tables, calculate indicators and perform basic statistics in R (or similar, SPSS, Stata, etc.).
- Produce epidemiological mapping of important medical and related data.

Objective 3: To provide continuity of monitoring and reporting of MERT activities.

- Keep program data and email well organized so that future mission epidemiologists can follow your work.
- Ensure that all teams involved in emergency preparedness, surveillance and response, receive or have access to relevant information.
- Share reports and findings with other sections through MERT and Syria coordination team.

Objective 4: Field Investigation & Rapid Assessment

- Deployment within 24–48 hours to alert locations to support field investigations in contexts affected by outbreaks, displacement, violence, or access disruption.
- Lead or support assessments of morbidity, mortality, transmission patterns, and population health needs.
- Conduct rapid diagnostic sampling and case verification when relevant (e.g. measles, cholera), following MSF safety protocols.
- Evaluate health-facility functionality, service availability, and potential public health risks.
- Produce timely investigation reports with actionable recommendations to inform response options.

Objective 5: Outbreak Response Support

- Under the guidance of Epidemioloigcal Activity Manager, provide technical analysis for outbreak response strategies (vaccination, case management, WASH-related interventions, community surveillance).
- Assist medical teams in establishing or strengthening surveillance systems at response sites.
- Train project and MoH/DoH staff on case definitions, alert reporting, and basic epidemiological methods.
